


It is particularly good to see the increasing enquiries about Genesis 2021 with early sponsors and delegates registering to secure their place on what may well be a sell-out

event in the new venue, 1 Wimpole Street. Undertaking the site visit last week immediately triggers that buzz as you realise what is coming.

### Where is Marie, (or Albert, Ada, Isaac ....)?

It was interesting recently to see the publication <u>CityAM</u> highlight the evolving skills challenge for the life sciences sector. With contributions from BIA and EuropaBio, the article sets out the




factors converging to create a skills challenge as an estimated 133,000 new jobs are to be created in the UK alone. That recruitment challenge, particularly in the 'Golden Triangle' has been highlighted by Cpl Life Sciences. Tracking sector vacancies across London,

Oxford and Cambridge it sets out that the 2,200 advertised vacancies thus far in 2021 represents 85% of the total seen in all of 2020, which was a good year.

The growth in Cambridge and London being evident with >90% of these vacancies being split between them. Such pressures can easily push up salaries, flexibility, turnover and recruitment challenges, in turn placing increasing emphasis for those recruiting to be an employer of choice and able to differentiate their Employee Value Proposition.

One Nucleus continues to run its Employer of Choice sessions, exploring how companies can support and develop their staff on matters they care about, be that diversity, neurodiversity, climate change or indeed remuneration. women's health and more. The next session on 28 September 2021 will discuss the <u>LGBTQ+ perspective on inclusivity and diversity</u>.



Our <u>current survey</u> asks our network about the barriers to increasing work-based learning. It is revealing a main barrier was felt to be the capacity of employers to accommodate placements, as illustrated. This will be the topic of debate at this week's <u>BioWednesday Webinar</u> – watch out for the recording on <u>YouTube</u> soon if you aren't attending.

### Being diligent

timeline of major advances in the sector, some of which underpin much of the innovation we cover in our eNews, events and conferences so I thought to share it here for others who may not have seen it.

Among other things, it lists the years the following happened:

- First clinical trial with DE27 (Humira) (1998)
- First enzyme replacement therapy to treat Fabry disease approved in the EU (2001)
- Human Genome Project completion (2003)
- First production of spider silk through biotechnology (2007)
- First approved cancer treatment using antibody glycosylation (GlycoMab) (2013)
- First curative gene therapy for ADA-SCID approved for infants (2016)
- Many more milestones at <u>EuropaBio 25 Years of Innovation</u>










# Silverstone Technology Cluster (STC) Annual Conference 2021 - How can we collaborate across the Oxford to Cambridge Arc?

Healx and Ono Pharmaceuticals – Al drug discovery in action

Cambridge based AI company Healx announced an exciting partnership with Japanese pharma company Ono Pharmaceuticals.

Healx are experts in the field of Al-powered drug discovery and development and have built a suite of frontier technologies to rapidly identify and progress new therapies for some of the 95% of rare diseases currently without an approved treatment. To address huge unmet needs, targeting the rare disease space was an excellent way to generate large volumes of data on various mechanisms and drugs that are now proving very relevant to cover more common disease signatures. This partnership aims to support Ono Pharmaceuticals in finding multiple new therapeutic indications for Ono's proprietary assets as well as expand the precision medicine and drug discovery capabilities of Healx in the rare disease space.
