










# **Deal of the Month**

#### Alloy Therapeutics raises \$75M in Series C

The biotechnology ecosystem company Alloy Therapeutics with headquarters in Massachusetts and European labs in Cambridge, UK raised a significant \$75M to extend its platform and services into adjacent biologic modalities and geographic areas.

This is logical continuity to the relatively recent company founded in 2017 but it is interesting to notice the round lead investors including 8VC, Presight Capital and Peter Thiel confirming the innovative business model approach Alloy is taking. A quote from Alex Kolicich, founding partner of 8VC compares Alloy's partnership and network approach to what accelerated technology developments 'We have seen firsthand how democratizing the product development process has transformed the technology industry through accelerating network effect. We are proud to support Alloy as they apply these lessons to the biopharmaceutical market'.

# **Funding & Support**

**SME Brexit Support Fund** 

HMRC is offering a grant up to £2,000 to help SMEs (fewer than 500 employees and less than £100M annual turnover) to cover practical support with new customs regulations post Brexit. This includes training and/or professional advice that can be used for support on how to complete customs declarations, how to manage customs processes and use customs software and systems, specific import and export related aspects including VAT, excise and rules of origin.
